BROOME FARM Tetchill, Ellesmere SY12 9BA.

Adjacent to the working dairy farm, the garden is set around the 18th & 19th C redbrick Farmhouse. A charming small garden with views across the fields to St Mary's Church Tower at Hordley.

Well tended lawns and beautifully planted borders.
