Key Messages from the Trustees Meeting on Sunday 26th January

We reviewed finances and salaries. Our Profit and Loss Statement at the moment is showing a small surplus (subject to change before the year end) and our investment advisers are cautiously optimistic for dividend payments over the coming months.

We agreed that John and Ann will draft a budget for 2025/26 to be agreed at the next trustees meeting.

We confirmed Jen Deacon as our delegate for the General Assembly (GA) annual meeting in April.

We agreed to move Candles of Joy and Concern from the first Sunday of the month to the fourth Sunday of the month. This will give more time before the first hymn for Bill to get to us from his earlier engagement at St. Alkmund's.

We agreed to look for the longer term at the current and future use of the church for events and how we manage this e.g. hire charges, need for more first aiders, stewards etc.., but we will wait for the MUA Sustainability Report before starting this work.


